Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) 2025

Operational English Version (Unofficial Translation)

Disclaimer: This document is an unofficial English operational translation of the official Indonesian SOP (SOP Pendakian Revisi 6 Tahun 2025). In the event of any discrepancy, the official Indonesian version prevails.

1. Purpose & Scope

This SOP regulates all trekking activities within Mount Rinjani National Park to ensure:

- Visitor safety and risk management
- Environmental protection and conservation
- Standardised operational requirements for trekking organisers
- Clear emergency and evacuation procedures
- Enforcement and sanctions for violations

2. Requirements for Trekkers

- Mandatory online registration via the official eRinjani system
- Valid medical certificate issued within 1 day prior to trekking
- Mandatory insurance (premium insurance compulsory from 1 January 2026)
- Minimum group size of 2 persons
- Compliance with Pack-In Pack-Out waste policy
- Trekking only on officially approved routes and dates
- Compliance with annual park closure (1 January – 31 March)

3. Requirements for Foreign Trekkers

- Must use a licensed Trekking Organizer (PB-PJWA)
- Guide ratio: Until 31 December 2025 – 1 guide per 5 trekkers
- From 1 January 2026 – 1 guide per 4 trekkers

4. Obligations of Trekking Organizers

- Maintain a single registered eRinjani account
- Ensure proper registration of trekkers, guides, and porters
- Provide certified and registered guides
- Provide registered porters
- Ensure availability of emergency equipment and communication devices
- Enforce waste control compliance
- Accept liability for violations committed by guides or porters

5. Emergency & Rescue Procedures

- Immediate first aid and stabilisation by guide
- Communication to Trekking Organizer and park authority
- Assessment for assisted descent or stretcher evacuation
- Manual evacuation to trailhead level if required
- Transfer to appropriate medical facility in Lombok
- Rescue coordination under park authority oversight

6. Waste Management Policy

- All waste generated during trekking must be carried out of the park
- No disposal of waste within conservation area
- Trekking Organizers are responsible for monitoring compliance
- Violations may result in sanctions or blacklisting

7. Sanctions & Enforcement

- Light, medium, and heavy violation categories apply
- Trekkers may be blacklisted for up to 5 years
- Guides and porters may have permits revoked
- Trekking Organizers may have licenses suspended or revoked
- Serious environmental or safety breaches may result in criminal charges

This operational English version is intended for international partners, schools, insurers, and trekkers seeking clarity on Mount Rinjani National Park regulations.
